

Katherine ("Kit") Kennedy is Senior Director, Climate and Clean Energy Program at the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC), with special expertise in energy efficiency, renewable energy, global warming solutions and air and water pollution. She leads NRDC's state and regional climate and clean energy advocacy across the United States with more than thirty years of experience as an environmental and clean energy attorney and advocate. NRDC is a non-profit environmental advocacy group, staffed by some 500 scientists, lawyers, and policy advocates across the globe.

From 2007 to 2010, Kit took leave to serve as Special Deputy Attorney General for Environmental Protection where she was responsible for the management, supervision, and direction of the New York State Attorney General's Office Environmental Protection Bureau. Her work at the Attorney General's Office included work on a diverse and challenging set of environmental issues across New York State and nationally.

Kit has taught environmental and clean energy classes at Yale Law School, Fordham Law School, and Vermont Law School. She serves on the boards of the New York League of Conservation Voters Education Fund, the Alliance for Clean Energy New York, and the executive board of the New York State Bar Association's Environmental Law Section. She is also a member of the American College of Environmental Lawyers. As the Timothy B. Atkeson Environmental Lecturer in Law at Yale Law School, she directed the Yale Environmental Protection Clinic.

Kit is a past honoree of the Annual Symposium on Energy in the 21^{st} Century for her dedicated environmental policy work for New York State and the entire country. She has been the Symposium moderator since 2007.
